Pediatrics 2011 at Williamsburg

The conference will provide you with the ability to: Discuss the diagnostic approach and management of children with growth disorders, thyroid disease, type 1 and 2 diabetes, polycystic ovarian syndrome, Turner syndrome, and gynecomastia. Discuss the role of calcium and vitamin D supplementation in bone metabolism. Review the pathophysiology of puberty and discuss variations in puberty development. Review the endocrinology effects of cancer treatment. Discuss metabolic syndrome and its management. Utilize a process which identifies the vital information needed in transitioning an adolescent diabetic patient from the care of a pediatrician to the care of a physician who manages adults. Relate the development of dysfunctional behavior to the family environment and apply evidence-based parent training to the management of dysfunctional behavior.
