### Ensures Quality

- Develops “Best Practice Standards” for HRPEN programs
- Provides on-going training opportunities for program staff and volunteers
- Encourages parent involvement in all aspects of program delivery

### Markets

- Promotes a positive community image for parent education and support
- Creates the expectation that parent education is a lifetime commitment
