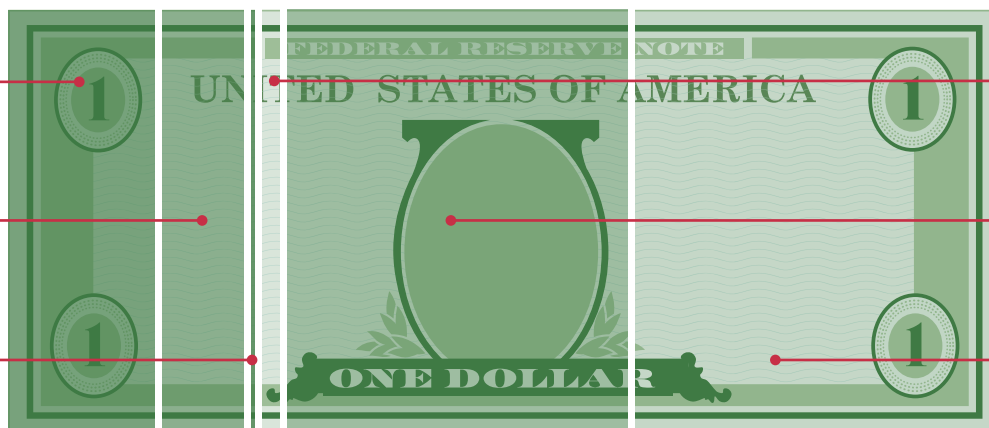

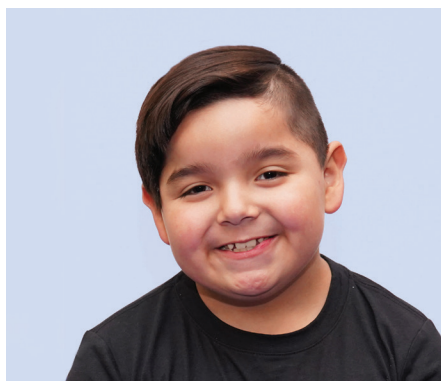

Julian was a toddler when doctors at Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters diagnosed him with glycogen storage disease, a rare genetic disorder that impairs the function of the liver and muscles. As a result, Julian endures constant muscle pain and fatigue. When he gets tired, he uses a wheelchair. Every day, it's a race against the clock to keep his blood sugar within a safe range. At age six, he needed a g-tube to help with his constant feedings. When his condition, exacerbated by the procedure, brought on anxiety and depression, parents turned to CHKD's mental health program for help. He learned coping mechanisms for what he describes as his "really bad days," including going for

a walk, taking a bath, and listening to music. Today, Julian also takes medication to lower his anxiety level. Despite the pain and challenge of living with glycogen storage disease, he always finds the strength to keep fighting. "It's so hard to live with a disability and anxiety, but you need to know that life is so beautiful," Julian wrote in a recent essay about his mental health struggles. "There are so many amazing doctors, people and therapists who have my back at CHKD. I'm not going to give up!"
